Educational Day

Saturday, October 13, 2012
Battle of Queenston Heights Re-enactment

Join us at Queenston Heights where historical interpreters, musicians, re-enactors and merchants will make history come to life! Take a tour of the battle site in the morning and climb the 235 steps to the top of Brock's Monument. Witness a re-enactment of the Battle of Queenston Heights in the afternoon, followed by a ceremony commemorating this historic event. After the ceremony, watch as a procession with Major-General Sir Isaac Brock's body leaves Queenston Heights for Niagara-on-the-Lake. This will be followed by a fireworks display on the Heights to commemorate the life of Sir Isaac Brock.

Sunday, October 14, 2012
Commemoration and Funeral of Major General Sir Isaac Brock

Ceremonies continue on October 14, 2011 with the funeral of Major General Sir Isaac Brock, and his fallen Aide de Camp, Lieutenant Colonel John Macdonnell. The funeral procession will carry the bodies towards Fort George National Historic Site, the original resting place of Upper Canada's Fallen Heroes. A commemoration of the life of Brock and MacDonnell will take place at Brock's Bastion, Fort George, followed by a Drumhead service and music by the Fort George Fife and Drum Corps. Closing ceremonies will take place inside Fort George, honouring the 200 years of peace and friendship that has existed between Canada and the United States.
